Telehandler Training Courses Toronto - Employers are responsible for making sure that their supervisory and operating personnel are trained to work proficiently making use of telehandler machinery. The competence level of workers should be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that workers obtain the required level of skill. The responsibility level of the person must be considered when training is provided. Effective training would solve any deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training may be undertaken through in-house session or by engaging the services of an external training provider. An assessment at the completion of the training period would determine whether or not the learning objectives have been met.

Guidelines and regulations for the basic telehandler operator training and testing are set by federal, state/provincial and local regulators. Basic training does not address such subject matters as the lifting of persons, the lifting of suspended loads, the operation of rotating machines or the use of other attachments. Further training must be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work place.

Inspection and maintenance

Like any machine, a telehandler requires effective maintenance. The equipment inevitably would suffer wear sooner or later. Right maintenance is important to ensuring safe use of the telehandler machinery. Checks and inspections are essential to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators must have machine-specific training to be able to monitor, prevent and rectify problems associated with wear, deterioration and damage. Workers require experience and competence in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The preventive maintenance instructions of the manufacturer must be seriously viewed and complied with, taking into consideration such factors as frequency of use and environmental circumstances in the work setting.

The user of the machine along with the owner of the machinery share the responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler is in full working condition. General maintenance is usually performed by the telehandler owner whereas pre-use checks are normally performed by the user.
