Forklift License Toronto - In North America, getting forklift certification or a forklift license involves classroom and hands-on training. Regulatory control over training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of federal, state and provincial groups. Operators could get a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. In any case, regulatory requirements need to be met. Recertification is required every two to three years.

The forklift is a powered industrial machine which is designed together with many options, such as stand-up and sit down models, propane and electric versions, and a wide variety of sizes and types to meet the industrial requirements of workers. Operator training courses are often individualized to be able address the certain uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered lift truck in a warehouse setting would not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up forklift in a shipyard. The variety of lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all businesses and equipment. Regulatory standards, therefore, have a tendency not to concentrate on specific course requirements but rather on the outcome of individual training programs.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common method for operators to be given their forklift license or certification. This method of certification needs the employer to provide practical training and classroom sessions on machinery within the workplace. Employers can opt to train employees on each and every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all equipment combined. The course incorporates lift truck operation methods, safety procedures, company rules and forklift maintenance. Topics particular to the worksite, such as hazardous materials or conditions, should be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely utilize and operate every type of lift truck on the worksite.

When utilizing a third party trainer, the certification process will normally consist of an on-site component with hands-on practice.

Typically, an employer-provided certification would not transfer from the existing employer to the next employer. Obtaining a forklift license through employer-provided training allows the operator to run a lift truck for that employer only.

The most significant aspect of forklift license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements differ from one kind of machinery to another. Safety issues vary from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to address extra requirements for safety training in applicable industries, such as in offshore and marine uses.
