It is vital that all workplaces making use of forklifts have the checklist below or one equivalent on the premises. If all of the safety rules are being followed, each of these questions must be answered with a "yes". A "no" to any question indicates a procedural weakness which might result in injury, damage to machinery or accident.

- 1) Is the operating area of the forklift separate from the traffic of pedestrians?
- 2) Is pedestrian access to travel areas of the forklift restricted by barriers?
- 3) The walkways for pedestrians are well-marked?
- 4) A sign is clearly visible stating a "lift truck in operation"?
- 5) Are mirrors for pedestrians and drivers provided at blind spots?
- 6) Changes or alterations to the daily lift truck schedule has been communicated to staff?
- 7) Are forklift tires suitable for utilization on all operating surfaces?
- 8) Is the seatbelt being utilized?
- 9) Is the seat in good condition?
- 10) The maintenance schedule of the forklift is being followed?
- 11) Is an annual forklift inspection and certification done?
- 12) Is the type of forklift appropriate for the job?
- 13) Does forklift has a readable load chart?
- 14) Do all operators understand how to read the load chart?
- 15) Does the chart list the safe capacity for various attachments and uses?
- 16) Do the forklift warning devices work right?
- 17) Is the operating speed control device fitted properly?
- 18) Is overhead cage fitted right on the forklift?
- 19) Have all lift truck operators acquired certification?
- 20) Are warning signs and speed limits being observed?
- 21) The operators have current training for the lift trucks being used?
- 22) Do operators know their duties to report any machine damage and forklift accidents?
- 23) Is the pre-test checklist reviewed every day prior to the equipment being used?
